**Subject: Local Enforcement Agency – Emergency Waiver of Standards
Sunshine Canyon Landfill, SWFP No. 19-AA-2000**

Dear Ms. Lugo:

Pursuant to the LEA's approval on April 20, 2020 for Emergency Waiver of Standards for Sunshine Canyon Landfill's, Solid Waste Facility Permit (Facility Number 19-AA-2000), below is a summary of the tonnage received at the site during the time period the waiver was in effect. The conditions of the Emergency Waiver of Standards in accordance with Title 14, California Code of Regulations (14 CCR), Section 17210.4 are the following:

1. The Emergency Waiver of Standards is in effect from April 20, 2020 through August 18, 2020.
2. Increase daily tonnage from 12,100 tons to 14,100 tons per day.
3. Increase weekly tonnage limit from 72,600 tons per week to 84,600 tons per week.
4. Increase landfill operating hours from 6:00am to 9:00pm (Mon. – Fri.) to 6:00am to 11:00pm (Mon. – Sat.) Hours for the receipt of refuse will remain the same as stated on the Solid Waste Facility Permit.

There were no late closures during the time period from April 20, 2020 to June 30, 2020.

Reporting conditions of the Emergency Waiver of Standards is in accordance with Title 14, California Code of Regulations (14 CCR), Section 17210.5 and are summarized in the following response:

1. (a) The solid waste facility operator shall submit a written report to the LEA and the local county agency (agency) within 90 days of activation of the waiver and every 90 days thereafter for the effective period of the activated waiver.


SCL has submitted herein this report and will continue until the waiver is no longer necessary and follow conditions 4 (d) below.

2. (b) The written report shall include the following information:
 - (1) The daily amount of disaster debris received, diverted, and disposed at the facility;
Please reference the daily tonnage tables in this report.
 - (2) The jurisdiction of origin for the disaster debris received at the facility;
The origin of waste did not change during this time period that the temporary waiver was in effect. Accordingly, no waste from outside the County of Los Angeles was accepted.
 - (3) The increase in tonnage or volume of waste received per day during the effective period of the activated waiver; and
Please reference the daily tonnages tables in this report.
 - (4) The facilities used to process the disaster debris.
During the time the temporary waiver was in effect, no changes were made to the origin of waste or facilities and entities facilitating waste hauling to the landfill.

In accordance with the SWFP, SCL continues to deliver the Monthly LEA Reports to the SCL LEA on the 15th of every month which includes the required information in conditions 2 (b).
3. (c) If pursuant to section 17210.2(d) of this Article, the waiver is extended beyond 120 days, the operator shall submit a report, as described in subparagraph (b), to the EA and agency. The report shall be submitted once every 90 days until the end of the effective period of the waiver.
SCL has submitted herein this report and will continue until the waiver is no longer necessary meeting condition 3 (c).
4. (d) After the activated waiver expires, the solid waste facility operator shall continue to submit the information requested in item (b) above to any EA and agency, every 90 days, until there is no longer any discernable disaster related waste being processed or stored at the facility.
SCL shall adhere to this condition at the expiration of the waiver and will report the required items in condition 2 (b).
